Last year, when I met with our Pastoral Relations Committee for my annual end of the year review, they asked me a question that has led to a lot of prayer, thought, research and soul searching. They asked, *“As you look five years out from now, what are some of the trends or issues you see our ministry here at CCC having to deal with?”*

Whenever you attempt to look to the future, you need to start by looking at the present. It's important to know where you are today, so that you can better understand where you may be tomorrow. In politics, we are most familiar with that process in something called the State of the Union Address. The requirement for a president to give a State of the Union is actually found in the US Constitution, where it states in article II, section 3, that the president *“shall from time to time give to Congress information of the State of the Union and recommend to their Consideration such measures as he shall judge necessary and expedient.”* Before Woodrow Wilson, that State of the Union was simply a report. Since Wilson, every president has given the State of the Union as an address to the combined houses of congress. It is seen as an opportunity for the president to report on the condition of the nation (the present) and to outline his/her plans for a legislative agenda that matches our national priorities as we move forward (the future). Simply put, the State of the Union is supposed to tell us where we are now and where we hope to go tomorrow.

Throughout the season of Lent, which we enter on Ash Wednesday, March 9<sup>th</sup>, Pastor Whitney and I will be preaching a series of sermons on Sunday mornings, that attempt to address the questions tied up in that initial question asked by the PRC. Where are we today, and where do you think we'll be tomorrow? The sermons will address the following topics:

- March 13<sup>th</sup> - An Introduction to Lent***
- March 20<sup>th</sup> - The State of the World***
- March 27<sup>th</sup> - The State of The Church (worldwide)***
- April 3<sup>rd</sup> - The State of the church (local)***
- April 10<sup>th</sup> - The State of Us***
- April 17<sup>th</sup> - The State of Me (Palm Sunday)***
- April 24<sup>th</sup> - The State of God (Easter Sunday)***

All of these sermons, deeply rooted in the Word of God, will look both at our present condition, and at the opportunities and challenges that seem to be ahead of us as we move forward in ministry as followers of Christ. We hope that this will stimulate good, healthy dialogue as we seek God's will for our congregation and our individual lives.

Join us too, each Wednesday evening at 7:30pm throughout Lent (beginning with Ash Wednesday, March 9<sup>th</sup>), as we gather for a series of Services of Lenten Prayer and Worship. Through singing, prayer, and meditation on and discussion of God's Word, we hope to make this a truly holy season of Lent that will better prepare our hearts and minds for the coming events of Holy Week.

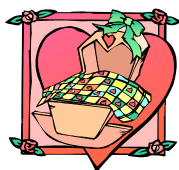

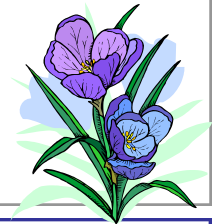


## Prayers

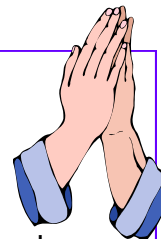

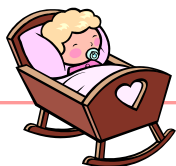

- ♥ Meals for you and your family. If there is ever a time where it would be helpful for you to receive meals from the church family to ease your burden we are here to help. Often families take advantage of this during times of childbirth, extreme stress, times of illness, recovery from surgery or a hospital stay or the passing of a loved one.

## ASH WEDNESDAY AND THE LENTEN SEASON

Through the centuries, Christians have observed the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection with great devotion. It became the custom of the church to prepare for Easter by a season of penitence, fasting, and prayer. This season of forty days provided a time in which converts to the faith were prepared for baptism into the body of Christ. It has also been the time when persons who had committed serious sins and had been separated from the community of faith were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness, and restored to the fellowship of the church. The whole congregation is thus reminded of the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ and the need we all have to renew our baptismal faith.

On Ash Wednesday, all are invited to enter into a holy observation of Lent. Throughout this season, we are called to honestly examine our lives, to be sincerely sorry for our sins, and to wholeheartedly recommit ourselves to God's purpose and direction in our lives. Christians have consistently found over the centuries, that prayer, fasting, gifts, and actions of service for others, along with reading and meditating on the Word of God, powerfully nourish our spiritual lives. As we begin this season, each of us is challenged to make a commitment to these practices, and to choose one in particular on which to focus, as we seek to grow in Christ.

### Holy Land Pilgrimage 2012

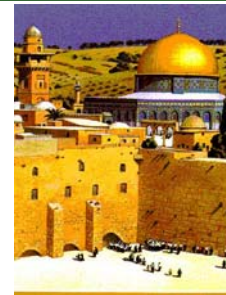
*Have you ever wondered what it would be like to see and feel and experience the land of the Bible?*

# Whitney's Whispers

As we enter into the season of Lent, I would like to present one option for a Lenten discipline. In recent years the ancient practice of praying at fixed hours has come back to the forefront of personal faith practices. Praying the divine hours means stopping on the hour 4 times a day to pray the prescribed prayers. Morning, Noon, evening and the Midnight hours are the 4 times, though the actual hour can vary. This discipline, which takes only a few minutes at each prayer, is a great way of reminding us to be present with God in the midst of our every day lives. There are a variety of ways to find the resources. You can find the divine hours online for free at [www.explorefaith.org/prayer/fixed](http://www.explorefaith.org/prayer/fixed). You can get e-versions of the Divine hours for your kindle or smart phone. And of course you can get hard copies of the books. I have ordered 10 copies of the springtime edition of the Divine Hours (compiled by Phyllis Tickle) and will be happy to share them with you – just contact me if you'd like to explore this avenue of faith. May God be with us as we pray, and may we remember his presence always.
