"He who began a good work in you, will be faithful to complete it." These words have been powerfully important to me for a long time. When I was a junior in high school my family was involved with a church plant and we were a small and close-knit group. Our good friends Dan and Elizabeth had come into our lives several years earlier as part of a group that was passionate about working with college students. They had come to live in our small town as a result of their calling to serve students attending UMass Lowell. They were young and hip and fun and as a kid I naturally assumed that they would always be in Lowell working with college students.



But my Jr. year of high school Dan and Elizabeth came to believe that God had given them a new location to minister in: Halifax, Nova Scotia. Of course they told all of us and we cried together and then laughed together as we began to head towards the transition of their leaving. I will never forget the last Sunday that they were with us in our little church that met in a cafeteria in a local middle school. They shared with us and we prayed with them. The heart of their sharing was the verse that I shared above.

As a high school student this was my first experience of a transition of this sort. I was struck by the faith that all of the adults in my world showed that God would continue to work both in the lives of our friends, in the community of our church and even on the campus of UMass Lowell even though Dan and Elizabeth would no longer be beside us.



As time passed and I began my own journey of ministry and came to recognize as I grew older how it is that people come and go from each other's lives - I came to see the amazing gift that that faith was. The reminder that we are in fact not only living out our own stories, and not only do all of our stories intersect in big and small ways - but that we are also all living out God's story.

As the Bible says: It is in him that we live and move and have our being.

It is that hope that has encouraged me through many years of church life and transition, through sending friends to be missionaries all around the world and it is that hope that brings me comfort and joy in the midst of my own transition away from CCC. I know that I have been changed and that I have grown and learned in my ministry here and that is because my story has intersected with yours. I am thankful that we are all a part of the story of God and that together His is the story we tell.

Pathfinders (grades k-2) meets occasionally following our church services. Our first gathering this year will be on October 16th.

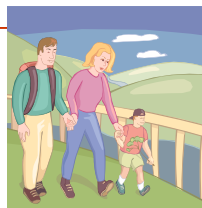

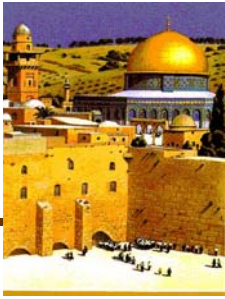

### **Where We Give**

Over the spring and summer months, the Stewardship Ministry has suggested two areas of giving for us to consider. The first was "Why we Give". Giving reveals His likeness in us and models His love. Through giving, we learn to become more dependent on God and less on ourselves.

## Questions and Answers with Pastor Whitney

### 1. Tell us about the idea of Pastor and PRC being in process together for discernment.

Pastors are always trying to be aware of areas of fit that are specific to them. We are constantly reassessing and trying to take stock of where we are in ministry. Over time it has become clear to me that there are areas where this congregation/location isn't the best long term fit. (it has taken a while for these differences to become obvious - which is why the analogy of a hexagon shaped peg in a round hole works so well) PRC shared their opinions, even as I formed my own and we arrived at a similar conclusion.

### 2. What are the areas of fit that you see experience disconnect between you and the church culture?

- Lifestyle (for lack of a better word). It is hard to be in a demographic (30's, unmarried, no children) that isn't really present in our congregation or community. That makes a long term fit for me here really difficult in terms of community connections and integration with the lives of many of our congregants
- My particular ministry skills are geared towards problem solving and challenge resolution - there isn't a whole lot of need for that in this congregation, simply because it is a long-term, well established church. All of which is good - but is maybe not fast moving enough for my skill set.
- Although I appreciate ceremony and ritual in church as well as traditional worship styles - I also value spontaneity and informality in worship. It has been hard for me to not have a lot of that.

### 3. Why are you leaving if you aren't going somewhere specific? What kind of things are you looking to do?

I felt in conjunction with the PRC that after these areas of fit had become clear that it's better for us to go our separate ways sooner and on good terms, than to allow any kind of existing frustrations to grow into an obstacle to our relationship with each other.

There are several paths that I will pursue concurrently until it becomes clear to me what the best next steps are. They include:

- congregational ministry in a more urban setting, with a focus on renewal and community connection
- PHD programs that would enable me to teach communications and homiletics
- Christian Ministry in a non-congregational setting (this takes all kinds of shapes so I'm pretty wide open here)
- more opportunities for speaking to youth and adults through camps, retreats etc...

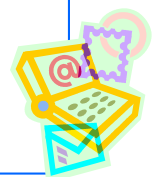

Dear brothers and sisters at Covenant Congregational Church,

I would like to thank you for the huge support you have been to me during my first two years in Sweden. I have been greatly encouraged through the many letters, emails, and cards I have received from you during my stay here. I have seen God answering your prayers for me as I have sent you prayer requests and then been able to share the same subjects with you again as thanksgivings a few weeks later. I have been able to live here, with food, shelter, clothing, and resources to do ministry, thanks to your generous financial support. I have even more to thank you for, as it was through the youth ministries of your church (and especially through your gift of a Bible) that I got to know Christ as a teenager and began to experience His call toward missions.

As I write to you, I have been serving as a short-term missionary in Sweden for about one year and eight months. As my initial contract was for two years, Covenant World Mission's original projected end for my stay is fast approaching.

I am very grateful for the time I have had in Sweden so far. During this time, I have seen God working through His church here. I have seen Him draw nonbelievers from Europe, Asia, and North America toward Himself, and have had the chance to be personally involved in conversations, Bible studies, meal times, and other events that have helped them along the way. I have seen international youth turn toward God, grow in the faith, and discover spiritual gifts, and have also had the chance to be personally involved in some of that through my work with the youth group here.

These 20 months in Sweden have also been a great time of growth for me. I have learned a lot about sharing the Gospel, especially the value of listening, hospitality, and cooperation with other believers. I have also developed significantly as a preacher, especially after being given the chance to preach at a camp for international youth this past summer. At the camp, I experienced that God used me in a powerful way and that He helped me to see some things that work well and some things that could be improved in my preaching style. Since the camp, I have received a few very random-seeming invitations to preach in different places, and I hope that God is continuing to develop this gift in me.

In fact, many new opportunities appear to be arising here in Sweden. There are new families coming to Fisher's Creek, with new youth to be welcomed, loved, and discipled. FC also has a new young adult ministry, which I have been asked to lead. So far, we have built up a great relationship with one of Gothenburg's universities through volunteering, and I believe there is huge potential for outreach. (For example: in a few weeks, 100 international students from the university will be having a dinner in our church building.)

I would like to continue to participate in what God is doing here in Sweden, so I have asked Covenant World Mission to lengthen my contract by one year (until January 2013). They have approved me to stay. However, I will need to raise 24,277 USD in order to live here for an additional year and do ministry. Since you have already been a part of the work here for the past two years, I thought that I should contact you about this need and opportunity. Any help that you could offer would be greatly appreciated. If you have too many other ministry commitments this coming year, I am still grateful for all the support you have given me. None of this would have been possible without you.

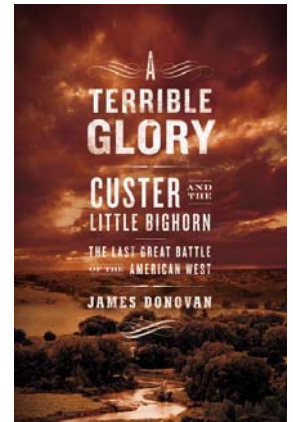


## Pastor's Book Club

A Terrible Glory: Custer and The Little Bighorn – The Last Great Battle of The American West  
James Donovan

A few years back I led a mission trip for the high school kids here at church to the Northern Cheyenne Indian Reservation in Lame Deer, Montana. It was an amazing trip that deeply touched all of us who went. For kids growing up in the suburbs, hills, woods and seashores of New England, the wide-open big sky prairie was truly awe inspiring. We worked for and with the families of the reservation, painting homes, cleaning common areas, and hosting a Vacation Bible School. It was exhausting and rewarding work. Each evening we had the opportunity to experience a bit of reservation life and history. One evening we witnessed a Pow Wow ceremony; we visited a Buffalo Jump; and on one particular evening, we made the 20 mile drive to visit the site of, and hear the story of The Battle of the Little Bighorn, more commonly known as Custer's Last Stand. On a windswept hillside/cemetery, our guide powerfully relayed the details of the historic event, and the impact it would forever have on those involved on both sides of the battle.

A Terrible Glory by James Donovan tells the story of The Battle of the Little Bighorn in exacting and deeply moving detail. His intensive research, using direct quotes from the journals and firsthand accounts of both soldiers and Native Americans, gives a multifaceted look at the hubris, arrogance and ineptitude of Custer and the US military commanders, the bravery of common soldiers on both sides, as well as the savagery of Plains Indian warfare in general. Donovan's research is so in-depth, that this really is a moment-by-moment account of the expedition, rather than an overview with a few details along the way. In many ways, this reads more like a novel than a history book, and I found myself deeply engaged as the battle played out, and the words of the combatants filled the pages. Simple maps showing the movement of forces as the battle progressed were helpful with the flow of the development, and a section of photographs of the main characters involved helped put names to faces. There's a "just right" amount of lead-in material before the expedition begins to paint a good picture of Custer and the Native American leadership so that we better understand them and their bearings, and the same with the follow-up to the battle information, which adequately wraps up the story. All in all, I found this to be a wonderful, exciting work of history.

Many of us hear of Custer at some point in our educational journey, but barely scratch the surface as to what happened. Here's the book to complete your education, and done in an engaging and energetic way. I recommend it to you as this month's Pastor's Book Club selection.
