# Covenant Congregational Church

Over the past few years, I've noticed the progression of my daughter as she has learned and grown as a soccer player. When she was very young the premise was simple: kick the ball into the goal. There was one singular focus, one main aim and one way to accomplish it: run towards the ball and kick it. What resulted was a group of youngsters traveling as a mob up and down the soccer field in a clump with a ball in the middle of a flurry of feet. As she has grown, the team's approach has changed. Not only has each individual player improved their form and technique, the actions of the players on the field have become more nuanced. Instead of all running towards the ball at once, they often will spread out, covering different areas of the field. There may be a set play where a player runs in a certain direction while another player looks to pass the ball into an open space for a clearer shot. Some even remain back to defend their own goal! Their aim remains the same: get the ball in the goal; but the technique and approach have developed to improve the ability to score.

When people discuss the goal of a church, our aim is quickly summarized in one word: Jesus. He is, indeed, the focus and aim of all we do, learn and worship. As the Apostle Paul writes "I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 3:14). But as we grow and develop in our faith, we recognize that there are many wrinkles and nuances in knowing Jesus Christ. Part of our growth is growing in faith and knowledge of God in Christ.

This January and February during worship, we will be focusing on the Covenant Affirmations. The Covenant Affirmations are ways of speaking with greater specificity and clarity about what our church believes. They are not a long, detailed doctrine statement, but instead several key points of understanding of what is important and guiding for our life together. Each Sunday we will focus on a different topic, go into detail on what it means, and then think creatively about how it is witnessed in our church.

So, yes, the answer will always be: "Jesus" and he will be our goal and aim. In this next year, let's improve our game-learning what it means to go deeper with our understanding of following Christ as his church.


