Celebrating 140 years of ministry

This fall, during the children's sermons, we've been collecting items for our journey in following God. Each Sunday, we learn about another story of the people of Israel as they followed God through the wilderness. Then the children look around the sanctuary for a new item to put into our backpack. Previous items have included a water bottle as we learned about how God provided water from a rock and snacks as we learned about how God provided manna in the wilderness.

On our Anniversary Sunday, we had a bit of a different item to help us on our journey: a mirror. While we might not need a mirror to help us on a walking trip, mirrors are desperately needed on a *driving* trip. We can learn some important lessons from how we use mirrors in a car and apply them to what it means to follow God well. First, mirrors are vital at keeping us safe. They give us a sense of what is around us and where we have been. Regularly checking our mirrors is an important part of being a safe driver. Second, mirrors help us in tricky situations. If you are in the midst of backing up or parallel parking, you must use your mirrors to navigate those unique times. Finally, mirrors support the act of driving. Despite mirrors being vital to our drive, they are not the central part of our driving. We don't drive by looking at the mirrors; we drive by looking out the windshield. In fact, just like driving without mirrors is likely to cause a crash, only driving with your mirrors is *certain* to cause a crash!

We thought about mirrors on our anniversary because the lessons apply to our church congregation. We ought to remember that it is vital to look back at the faithfulness of God in our past. Regular work of ministry should involve regular remembrance of how God used us in the past. Particularly in tricky times of transition and change, we should "check our mirrors." That said, most of our time should be spent looking out the windshield at where God is taking us and planning and preparing for the coming trip! If not, we're nearly certain to crash.

There are tendencies of churches to miss in both directions. One type might barrel full speed ahead working in ministry and mission, not pausing at critical junctures to look at how this match with how God worked in the past. Others might spend most of their time looking in the mirrors-either being distracted from the road in front of them by what was behind them or, potentially even stopping the car and looking backward for long stretches of time. Churches are best when they face forward toward the future, regularly glancing in the mirrors to get a sense of orientation.

What a great Sunday we had this past October when we "checked our mirrors" and remembered God's faithfulness to our forebearers in faith. As someone told me, "We look pretty good for 140!" Let us use that "mirror check" to help our driving in the future, as we look out the window to the road ahead. God is still leading us; let us follow him by driving forward in faith.


