

# The TIDINGS

## Covenant Congregational Church

I modified this month's devotion from the sermon I gave at the community Thanksgiving service last year. If you are able, I strongly encourage you to join in this year's gathering with other houses of worship from around Easton on Sunday, November 23rd at 6:30pm. This year's host is Unity Church (13 Main St) and Rabbi Ken Carr will share his thoughts.

If your Thanksgiving table is anything like mine, there will be a moment during the course of the meal that Uncle Brad or some other well intentioned person, raises their glass, gets everyone's attention and declares: "I think we should go around and have everyone say what they are thankful for."

And if your Thanksgiving table is anything like mine, each person will share in turn what they are thankful for: health, family, good food, peace on earth. But if your Thanksgiving table is anything like mine, the vast majority of these mentions will be broad and general: health, in general; good food, broadly speaking; peace on earth, all told. Don't we all often leave our thankfulness to generalities? That is to say: What is it about our family for which we are thankful? Which dishes of food are we thankful for (and which did we pass by in the buffet)?

Several weeks ago, I came across an online video. In it an individual described, in minute detail, all that was involved in the making of a #2 pencil. Certain people and an elaborate process, would be involved in the making of the red eraser, for example, the rubber sourced from one country shipped to a processing plant in another. Still another would take the processed rubber and shape it into an eraser which would then be shipped again. An entirely different process, with an equally elaborate supply chain, would be involved in making the small metal clasp to hold that eraser to the pencil. Imagine, he said, the individuals who, decades ago, planted the trees that would be harvested to provide the wood for that same pencil. And on and on the description went. Rarely have I thought to give thanks for something as small and ordinary as a #2 pencil, but now I might! We all have many, specific and detailed reasons to be thankful.

I want to encourage us to be thankful for the details this year. I think if we are thankful for the details it might cause us to more deeply understand those places of blessing in our lives. We become more aware of what we are actually thankful for-not sweeping generalities but specifics. If we are thankful for the visit of a specific family member or friend from far away, we may be more likely to reach out in similar ways in the future. If we are thankful for a certain round of chemotherapy that kicked our friend's cancer to the curb, then we can more compassionately come alongside others dealing with similar journeys. If we love grandma's dinner rolls, we might ask for the recipe. Detailed thanks help us to understand how we are blessed. This will make us aware of those places of brokenness still around us-and how we might help to solve those troubles.

We might be thankful for our family, but recognize the brokenness a divorce or death brought in the previous year. We might be thankful for our health and in turn be advocates for those who struggle through the red tape of insurance or finding healthcare at all. We might be thankful for a warm home, and so volunteer with Mainspring House. Detailed thanksgiving allows us to see the places of pain and work to help fix them.

So this Thanksgiving, perhaps you want to spend some time specifically thinking of what you are thankful formaybe list them in detail; so when Uncle Brad raises his glass and asks for our participation, perhaps try to offer your example in detail. I'm grateful for this warm home, and I'm hopeful more people get on their feet next year; I'm grateful for the safety our first responders give us here in Easton, I know that's not true everywhere; I'm grateful for my child's teacher this year, she really understands him. And if those thanks are hard to come by-as some years they are-know you are not alone. And if you can't come up with anything else, just raise your glass and say: "I'm thankful for #2 pencils." -Pastor Ryan

Suggested Items are as follows:

- ☐ Toiletry items (soap, shampoo, mouthwash, toothpaste/ toothbrush, comb, tissue packets, nail clippers, lip balm, hand sanitizer)
- ☐ Winter knit hats, heavy duty gloves, a pair of white or black crew socks
- □ Cough drops, vitamin C drops, gum, hard candy
- ☐ Air fresheners
- □ Bandanas
- ☐ Paper notepads and pens
- ☐ Sewing/mending kit
- □ Finally, insert a Christmas card and wrap the box in festive paper.
- □ Drop off shoeboxes at the church during business hours or after church services. The deadline to deliver shoeboxes is **December 7, 2025**, after Sunday service.

The shoebox gifts are presented and opened by the seafarers as a group. We recommend using standard loafer shoebox size roughly 12" X 7" X 5". The above suggested items have been reviewed by New England Seafarers Mission but feel free to add additional items. Some examples are sun screen, hand cream, rain poncho, deck of cards, mini flashlight.
