Celebrating a 140 years of ministry

Each week in my church office, I sit down and create a "to do" list for the coming week. A successful week is one where I get my goals accomplished. This is why I like the Jesus I see on Palm Sunday: he sets goals and completes them. At other moments in his life and ministry, it seems Jesus wanders and wonders: caught up in the midst and tide of the people around him. One might say he spends too much time being distracted by children, key moments that could be used spreading his message he spends in prayer, he pops from village to village seemingly with no rhyme or reason, and he eats too often with shady characters. On Palm Sunday, though, it seems Jesus sees a goal and completes it. Jesus decides to head to Jerusalem for the Passover festival (check), he and the disciples travel from their homes in the north, in Galilee, south towards the city over the course of several days (check), he makes his base outside the city at the home of friends Mary, Martha and Lazarus (check), he sends his disciples on to secure a donkey to ride as he enters the city (check), and Jesus enters the city to roaring and adoring crowds (check). It is a plan, he has a goal, and he completes it. We like people who set goals and complete them.

What happens when our goals unravel? What happens when our checklists are not enough? The Bible says that "death comes like a thief in the night." Unexpected, unexplained, it breaks into our lives and steals our hope and derails our plans. But it is not only death who comes and steals. Unemployment, dementia, divorce....they all come and steal and destroy.

Death did not come on Jesus like a thief; he knew what was coming for him, even on Palm Sunday. From the disciples' perspective Holy Week, though, the week from Palm Sunday to Good Friday, certainly feels like all these grand plans have fallen apart. They would have liked Jesus to stick to their goals and complete them: to bring about the overthrow of the Roman Empire or usher in the coming of the Kingdom of Israel in power. But had the disciples listened to Jesus, they would have heard his actual plans: to go to Jerusalem and to die for the nation and the world and to rise again from the dead three days later. And so their grand plans for Jesus fall apart over Holy Week: the great crowds which lined the streets on Sunday thinned, the disciples fled, and Jesus was convicted of blasphemy and treason, and hung on a cross.

On Resurrection Day, we celebrate the fact that our hope comes not from the goals we set and the tasks we complete but from Christ's victory over death. Life does not depend on what we do or complete. True and eternal life comes from trusting in a relationship, it comes from our Father, it comes through the Son, and God's ability to make all things right in the world.
